External Sharing

You want to disposition one of your Blue-tongued Skinks (*Tiliqua gigas*) and Roger Williams Park Zoo is very interested in acquiring it. They would like to review your records on it first before they make a decision. You select to share this record with them. Normally, in a global view of a record much of the information is

not displayed and Notes are filtered by specific

Types. The screen background of a global record

(a record created by another institution)

is blue. When you choose to share a record all Notes are displayed as well as other information such as Feed Logs, Training Information,

Permits and Management Plan.

For the other institution the screen background

of a shared record is white. However, if you created that record, your screen will remain pink.

The record will continue to be shared until the sharing is removed by the Holding Institution.

External Sharing of an animal record is also valuable for animals you have in on loan. If you share the record with the owning institution they are always up-to-date with what is happening with their animal. This does not replace the yearly updates usually requested on loan animals.




External Sharing

Records that are being shared will display in the External Sharing grid in My Institution. Here we have shared our skink. In addition you can share entire taxonomies and we have shared all of our giraffe records with the Toledo Zoo.





If the record is being shared it will display in the animal record in the External Sharing grid. Here you can share with another institution or delete the current sharing.



You can tell that you are looking at a shared record because the background is white.
