## **Studbook News Feed**

You are the studbook keeper for sugar gliders (*Petaurus breviceps*). You just came back from a lengthy vacation and find in your emails a reminder that the Marsupial and Monotreme TAG wants updated studbooks as soon as possible for a meeting next week. Instead of contacting all your holding institutions for updates on what happened in your population over the past month you use ZIMS and open the Studbook

News Feed. You filter by Recorded Date Range and instantly get an update for the information recorded over the past month. You update your studbook, submit to the TAG, and get a round of applause for your speedy response.



## Studbook News Feed



Only Studbook Keepers have access to the Studbook News Feed. By default the Studbook News Feed displays the most current information at the top. Using the left hand search box you can filter by specific institutions, animals, events or date ranges.

Red arrows to the left indicate an animal left the facility (death or disposition). Green arrows to the right indicate an animal arrived at the facility (birth or acquisition). There are hyperlinks to the taxonomy and institution modules. Using the Animal ID or GAN hyperlinks you can go directly into the record for details regarding the transaction.
